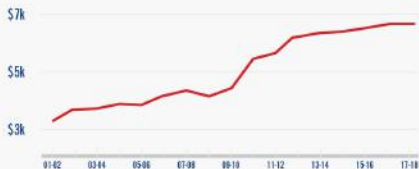

TUITION



From 2001-02 to 2017-18, average tuition and fees in the UNC System more than doubled, even after accounting for inflation—from **\$3,366 to \$6,933**.

Students are paying more tuition out of pocket: The average net price of tuition (including aid) was **\$7,243** in 2009, compared to **\$10,858** in 2016.

Higher tuition prices mean that fewer students will enroll. One recent study found that for every \$1,000 increase in tuition prices, **3 percent** fewer students enrolled.

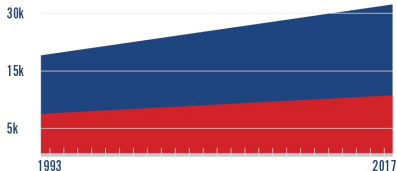
Continuing to keep tuition low will ensure access to the broadest possible base of North Carolina students.

Published 2017-18 tuition and fees for undergraduates in the UNC System were nearly **16% less** than the national average for public universities.

UNC System students also enjoy more grant aid: **\$8,079** compared to the U.S. average of **\$6,674** in 2018.

FACULTY, ADMINISTRATION, AND STAFF

Since 1993, the number of full-time non-instructional staff positions in the UNC System grew by **60%**. During that same time period, full-time instructional staff grew by just **34%**.

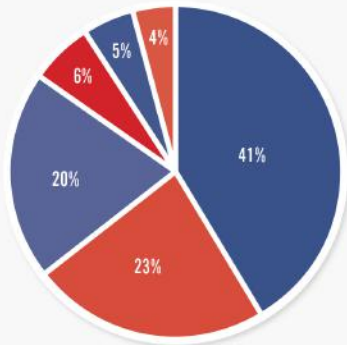
At most UNC System schools, there are **twice as many** non-instructional staff as faculty.



More than 1,500 employees in the UNC System earn more than **\$200,000** each year (not including benefits).

Salaries for the chancellors of the UNC System's 16 universities range from a low of **\$291,305** (Winston-Salem State University) to a high of **\$632,810** (UNC-Chapel Hill and NC State).

HOW THE UNC SYSTEM IS FUNDED:

41% from state appropriations

23% from tuition and fees

20% from government grants and contracts

6% from other core revenues

5% from private gifts, grants, and contracts

4% from investment return



In 2017, UNC-Chapel Hill's endowment was worth over **\$3 billion**, while NC State University's was **\$1.1 billion**.



The UNC System constituted **nearly 13%** of the state budget in 2018.
